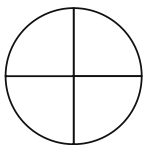

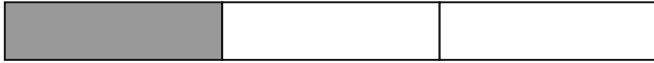

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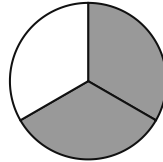
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3. This bar is split into thirds. How many equal shares make one whole?



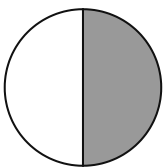

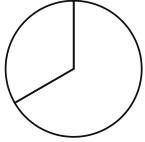

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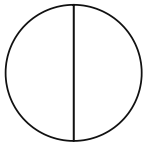
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7. Which model can be called halves? Check the size, not only the number, of the shares.
