

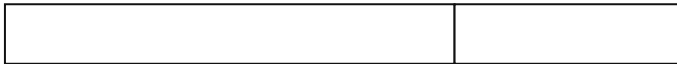

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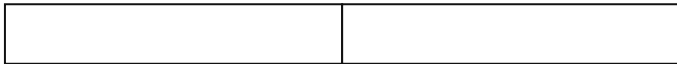

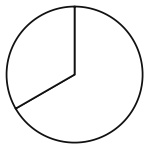

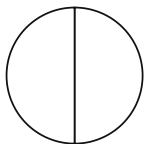


2. Choose the circle split into 2 equal shares.

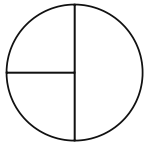


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3. Choose the circle split into 3 equal shares.

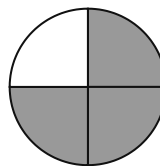


4. This bar is split into halves. How many equal shares make one whole?

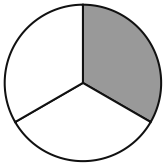

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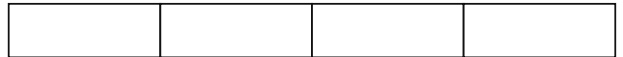

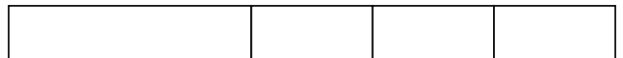
