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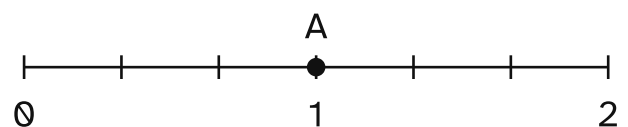
6. Write 2 as a fraction with denominator 4. Which reason would help you solve this correctly?
