2. Write $\frac{11}{12}$ as a sum of two positive fractions with denominator 12.

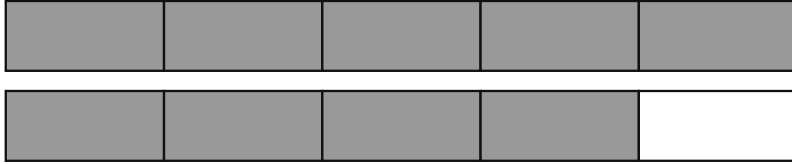
